Washington, DC is defined by two rivers, the Potomac and the Anacostia. The Anacostia is definitely the lesser-known of the two, fragmented by infrastructure, former industrial sites and largely without attractive public spaces.

The Anacostia River corridor has undergone dramatic changes in the last ten years and is now the focus of the city's Anacostia Waterfront Initiative (AWI). This focus of attention has led to the development of conceptual plan for the communities on both sides of the river. Mayor Anthony A. Williams has set the restoration of the Anacostia waterfront as a top priority for his administration.
